The Pennrose Foundation was founded in 2018 with a mission *to improve the lives of the disadvantaged people and communities served by Pennrose*. The 2021-2022 academic year will be the Foundation's third year of offering scholarships to qualified residents who are pursuing some form of higher education, in college, trade/professional school, or institute. We were able to increase the number of scholarship recipients in 2020 and hope to expand on the quantity and value of scholarships awarded again.

It is our goal to provide financial support to our residents who are pursuing academic achievement.

Scholarship Information

Eligibility

All high school students who plan to begin post-secondary studies at colleges or trade/professional schools are eligible for these grants provided he/she resides on an affordable site that is professionally managed by Pennrose. The applicant/family must be in good standing with the rules and regulations of HUD and Pennrose.

High school graduates that reside at sites managed by Pennrose who are currently enrolled in college undergraduate programs or trade/professional school and plan to return to post-secondary studies for the 2021-2022 school year are also eligible and may apply for a Pennrose scholarship. A matriculated boarding student may apply provided his/her primary residence is with a parent/guardian residing on an affordable site that is managed by Pennrose (applicant/recipient must be named on all applicable lease documents). Applications for graduate level programs will not be accepted.

Selection Criteria

The criteria used to select scholarship recipients includes academic performance and character reference. Academic performance is determined by evaluating high school or college grade transcripts released to the Foundation by the student.

All high school students applying must possess a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent. All matriculated college students applying must possess a minimum of a 2.3 grade point average on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent.

Character will be evaluated through examination of an essay written by the student and a reference provided by an individual the applicant selects.

Description of Awards

Each of the awards will represent a \$2,000 scholarship provided to the selected students. These scholarships should not be mistaken in any way for student loans, and do not need to be repaid. While a high school student may apply for consideration for a scholarship prior to being accepted at a college or trade/professional school, he/she must provide documentation in the form of an admissions acceptance letter to the Foundation before the scholarship will be finalized.

Payment of Scholarships

All scholarships are made payable to the college or other post-secondary institution where the recipient will attend during the 2020-2021 school year. The student must provide the Foundation a copy of an admissions acceptance letter to an accredited school. It is the intent of the Pennrose Foundation that the full amount of these scholarships will be applied toward the recipient's school expenses.

Application Procedure

There are four parts of this application and all must be received for the Pennrose Foundation to consider an application.

The deadline for completed applications is April 1, 2021. Please email Parts I, II, III, and IV (listed below) to info@PennroseFoundation.org or mail to Carrie Holak, Pennrose Foundation Scholarship, 1301 North 31st St., Philadelphia, PA 19121.

- I. The completed Application Form that contains basic information about the applicant, as well as, the applicant's and parent/guardian statement with signatures.
- II. An official grade transcript that shows the courses you have taken and the grades awarded through the fall semester of the 2019-2020 school year. These transcripts will allow us to evaluate academic performance. College students should request their transcripts no later than March 9, 2021.
- III. Use the attached reference form to secure a reference. This reference should come from a person who has firsthand knowledge of your functioning as a student on a regular basis. The Pennrose Foundation assumes that recommendations from teachers, guidance counselors, professors, principals, deans, and/or other school administrators are better indications of a student's future performance in school than personal recommendations. As a result, this recommendation should come from the aforementioned type of individuals. **References from relatives and personal references will not be accepted.**
- IV. A required 400-word essay that provides insight into your story, your motivations, and the next steps toward your future (see below information about Required Essay). Failure to complete the **REQUIRED** essay portion of the application will **DISQUALIFY** your eligibility to receive a scholarship award.

REQUIRED ESSAY:

The selection committee would like to gain insight into your story, your motivations and the next steps toward your future.

In an essay of approximately 400 words (typed), please explain specifically:

- What are your education goals?
- What do you hope to do following graduation?
- Why are you qualified to receive a Pennrose Foundation scholarship?

Notification Procedure

The selection committee will meet during the month of April. All applicants will be notified by June 6, 2021.

Important Dates and Deadlines

March 9, 2021	Suggested deadline for college students to request grade transcripts from their registrars to assure that part of the application will be received by the Foundation prior to April 13, 2021.
April 1, 2021	FINAL DEADLINE for all parts of the application for a 2021 Pennrose Foundation Scholarship. Mail the application form, references, essay and grade transcripts to info@PennroseFoundation.org or mail to Carrie Holak, Pennrose Foundation Scholarship, 1301 North 31 st St., Philadelphia, PA 19121.
June 1, 2021	All applicants notified of the outcome status of their application.
June 26, 2021	Acceptance forms must be returned by this date if scholarship recipients wish to accept the offer of a scholarship. Scholarships not accepted by this date will be awarded to other applicants.
August 8, 2021	Scholarship checks, made payable to post-secondary institutions, will be mailed via U.S. mail directly to the post-secondary institution on behalf of the scholarship recipient to help pay for the student's 2021-2022 school year costs.
